Can you believe it's been 50 years since the release of the movie Jaws! For some folks, and especially for me, the movie has had such a dramatic impact on life. I grew up in Pittsburgh, PA. The first time I visited the beach was in the summer of 1975 when we took a family vacation to visit relatives in Florida. I was 10 years old. And, of course, we saw the movie while there. As a young boy, the movie terrified me. To this day, I can't go in the ocean without hearing Jaws music ... daa dum, daa dum... Thank you Stephen Spielberg and John Williams (who composed the film's score).

Well, what does this have to do with occupational health and safety? The answer is Risk. I realize that the likelihood of getting bitten by a shark is extremely low; with odds estimated at 1 in 11.5 million. I get that, but I'm still not getting in the water. It's a risk that I'm not willing to accept. What about the employees that we strive to protect from workplace hazards? What risks are they willing to take to get the job done? What is their perception of risk? What risks do they accept, tolerate, ignore, or avoid? The truth is that we all carry our own perceptions of what is acceptable or unacceptable. So, in celebration of the 50th anniversary of Jaws, I encourage you to discuss risk with your employees. Recognize how external factors (time, budget, personnel resources, and sharks) affect our perception of risk. Determine what is acceptable; make sure it aligns with management; and seek to modify employee behavior. Peter Benchley, the author of the novel 'Jaws' published in 1974 said it perfectly, "Intellectually, they knew a great deal. Practically, they chose to know almost nothing."

Enjoy what's left of summer. And please know that the Board has been working very hard to secure speakers for the Fall Conference. We look forward to seeing you at Myrtle Beach, with the sharks!

The Pat Curran Memorial Scholarship

Pat began his career in North Carolina State Government in 1972 and worked in the Division of Public Health in various capacities until his retirement in 2004. Pat continued to consult with industry and teach during his retirement. Through his working and retirement years, Pat served on many boards and committees and his greatest pleasures were helping people with their occupational and environmental health concerns and mentoring the next generation of safety and health professionals. He served as an Adjunct Professor at UNC-Chapel Hill: Environmental Sciences and Engineering-Gillings School of Global Public Health. Pat also taught at ECU in the Master of Science in Occupational Safety Program-College of Engineering and Technology.

Pat's outstanding work and contributions did not go unnoticed and upon his retirement from the State of North Carolina, he received the Order of the Long Leaf Pine from the Governor in recognition of his extraordinary service to the state. In 2010, Pat received the Warren Cook Award from the Carolinas Section of the American Industrial Hygiene Association for outstanding contributions to the profession of industrial hygiene.

Most recently, Pat received the Robert T. Hughes Memorial Award from the American Conference of Governmental Industrial Hygienists which recognizes outstanding individuals in the field of industrial ventilation.

Scholarship Eligibility Criteria

In awarding the Pat Curran Memorial Scholarship, the recipient should be:

- Enrolled at the graduate or undergraduate level at a university in Carolina's Local Section geographic area in an ABET-accredited program with an emphasis in occupational health.
- • Maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 out of 4.0 scale, or a B average.
